Students will have the option to dress up in their Halloween costume on Thursday, October 31, 2024. We will have a morning parade in the gym so everyone can show off their costumes. A few reminders on Halloween costumes:

- Costumes cannot be too scary (we don't want to scare younger students). If unsure, discuss with Mr. Wellingham prior to October 31, 2024.
- Costumes must be respectful and must be culturally appropriate. If unsure, please discuss with Mr. Wellingham.
- No fake (or real) weapons at all.
- Keep the costumes simple. Students still need to be learners during their day at school.
- Students need to be aware that costumes may tear, get damaged, or break.
 Please have a discussion with your child about this before they wear their costume to school. Parents may wish to have a simpler or even a different costume than the one used on Halloween night.
